From gorges... to 100 valleys

It is a plateau Highland grove cut by many small valleys (hence its nickname of the land of 100 valleys) and the Aveyron and Viaur gorges. An infinitely varied landscape, which includes Ségala, lower Lot Valley and the Bassin de Decazeville, the Gorges de l'Aveyron, the country Viaur, small Causse. In terms of architecture, diversity is equally striking: small built heritage caselles and dovecotes, medieval walled towns, villages and large farms Ségala fluctuating between Slate and tile bear witness to the industrial past of the Decazeville basin...

Two thousand years of history and a cathedral

Rodez represents both work and power. The power of a cathedral emerged in the depths of centuries where art, history and vitality mingle. Firmly anchored on a rocky outcrop, the capital of the Ruthenians still seems to prevail over the broad Aveyron valley and the surrounding plateaus. Upstream of Rodez, the Aveyron river flows through a wide valley dominated by the topography of the Séverac Causse and the immense Palanges forest. Here you'll see Laissac, a town known for its livestock market, the 2nd biggest in France. Further along is Séverac castle fort, perched on its promontory.



CARLADEZ AND LA TRUYÈRE GORGES

Between two worlds

Imagine a plateau cut by two mighty rivers: that's the Carladéz.

In the extreme north of Aveyron, it hesitates between Rouergue and Auvergne, between the Cantal Mounts and the first southern chestnut groves.

Here, the Salers cows are reared as well as Aubrac cows and people enjoy truffles as much as aligot... and families walk together on the Sentiers de l'Imaginaire (paths of the imaginary).

Three large hydroelectric dams have been built over the Truyère: Sarrans, montézie and Couesque. These reservoirs, remarkable in many ways, have made it possible for the area to offer a diverse range of tourist attractions, and develop a famous fishing destination... and they're also a model of low environmental impact.





The pays d'Olt

Olt, was the name of the River Lot before the French language imposed its law on the Occitans. Fortunately our language triumphed, at least as far as names are concerned. Really, don't you think that Olt sounds better? Separating Aubrac from the rest of the world (well, the south side), the Lot crosses the Aveyron from the east to the west. A lively, powerful river, which has dug deep gorges in the landscape. Upstream, the widest points of the valley saw the establishment of towns along the riverbanks that radiate towards the surrounding plateaus. Saint-Geniez d'Olt, Sainte-Eulalie d'Olt, Saint-Côme d'Olt, Espalion, Estaing, Entraygues at the confluence of the Truyère. All have a remarkable architectural heritage, which reflects the rich history of this valley.

Not far away, on the Causse Comtal, Bozouls marks the passage to Haut-Rouergue. Here you'll find one of the most wonderful natural curiosities in Aveyron: Bozouls Canyon.

Mountains and lakes

The Lézévou is a vast plateau which covers the centre of Aveyron, between the Tarn and Aveyron gorges at an average of 900 metres altitude. A harsh winter climate that is conducive to predator fishing while the summer weather favours aquatic activities due to the number of lakes. A vast preserved space, which extends out of sight, alternating forests, pastures, hedgerows and small valleys with clear flowing waters.

In this rural landscape which is like a snapshot of rural Aveyron where the lakes of Lézévou come to nest.

At the north end of Vallon lies Conques, a major stopping place for pilgrims on the Way of St James. Its old half-timbered houses covered with thickstone have remained unchanged for a thousand years. They stand beside two wonderful UNESCO World Heritage Sites: the Romanesque Abbey Church and its Treasure.

ROQUEFORT COUNTRY AND LARZAC

A country of legends...

A great and beautiful tradition built this country and guides men towards their future.

Here, for many centuries, the famous Roquefort cheese was produced and slowly matured in the village's natural cellars. So for how long exactly? This is a difficult question as human life is closely linked to bovine rearing from the earliest ages. Absolute certainty, which serve as proof to the UNESCO world heritage: for 3000 years, together men and sheep roam these lands that they have slowly wrested from the forests, built, meshed with paths, farms and villages. See herds of sheep trail across the Larzac plateau as far as the eye can see. This story, that of the Templars Hospitaliers, the great religious orders and local lordships was built around these first founding elements which are just as alive today.


